I. Prerequisite

- The nobility and the aristocracy must prepare an opening statement on their stances.
 - This statement can be a minimum of 200 words.

II. Speakers' List

- The nobility and the aristocracy can read their opening statements to the rest of the House.
 - All participants will be given 2 minutes to read the opening statement
 - The House can prepare 2 questions, 2 follow-ups, and 2 commentaries.
 - Adding up to 2 points to the speaker is permitted.

III. Moderated Caucus

- The nobility and the aristocracy must share and discuss the matter of the House in a respectful manner.
- The nobility and the aristocracy must come to a mutual understanding of the situation in preparation for writing the Proposal Statement.

IV. Unmoderated Caucus

- The nobility and the aristocracy must create a Proposal Statement.
 - The Proposal Statement consists of an introductory belief statement and a minimum of 5 valid reasonings, following the “, and” format.
- *Splitting the house is permitted during the Unmoderated Caucus.*

V. Voting for Seconders

- The nobility and the aristocracy will vote for 5 seconders, in which the 2 with the most votes will be automatically chosen as the speakers.
- If the House had been split previously and there had been more than one proposal statement, two rounds of voting for seconders would have been in order.
 - Only the members of respective houses are permitted to vote for the seconders to present their Proposal Statement.
 - As a result, 5 seconders from *each* house will be elected, in which 2 with the most votes will be automatically chosen as the speakers.

VI. Voting for Proposal

- The Speakers' List must be reopened.

- The two speakers will have the floor to read the Proposal Statement to the rest of the House for 2 minutes.
- The House is permitted to use 2 questions, 2 follow-ups, and 2 commentaries for the speakers.
 - Adding up to 3 additional points is permitted.
- Voting for the Proposal Statement (In Favor, Against, Abstain) would be in order through roll call or acclamation.
- If the House is Split and there is more than one Proposal Statement, there will be two rounds of voting.
 - Only the members of the house can vote for their respective Proposal Statements.

VII. Reading for the Council

- Once the Proposal Statement becomes official through a majority vote, the two speakers will present it to the Council of Anjou.
- The Council of Anjou will decide whether the Proposal Statement is accepted or rejected.
- If the House was previously split and there is more than one Proposal Statement, only one of them can be accepted.
 - If both Proposal Statements are rejected, the House is expected to reopen previous motions to amend or recreate their Proposal Statements.
