Futuristic Committee Explanation

One of the most critical, often difficult aspects about international politics is envisioning how decisions made today affect the world of tomorrow. How might our advances in genetic engineering shape what it means to be human? How will drone technology change the dynamics of armed conflicts? How will forces such as climate change affect our economy and culture?

The purpose of the Futuristic Security Council (FSC), is to grapple with those kinds of questions - not so much to find definite answers, but rather, to allow delegates to realize the influence and role our current era has in defining the future. By envisioning a future shaped by our current reality, we hope to invite participating delegates to view the present from a new angle- an angle that considers the repercussions of long-term solutions, of our current relationship with the environment, and shifts in international politics. Essentially, the IMMUNS FSC serves as a new way to analyze our current reality; it forces us to ask ourselves: if we continue on this path, where will we end up?

The committee will try to create what we believe is a realistic Security Council set in 2084, using our current social and political context to stem our fictional conflicts. This means delegates will tackle issues that might be insignificant or even just in their initial stages, with geopolitical stage different from our current one. The committee will be composed of a diverse set of nations – many that already exist, others that will be new. The FSC will discuss two topics, of which one will be a crisis simulation. IMMUNS will be providing all relevant documents, such as the background paper, preparation tips, and country profiles in January. It is recommended that delegates first read the background paper and afterwards the country updates, where they can find more detailed information about their country.

The FSC breaks away from traditional forms of Model UN simulations. For this reason we invite experienced and skilled delegates to consider signing up.
